Brief Description of Research Project	This project examines local and state level responses to changing demands on public street space during the COVID-19 pandemic. Cities across the US moved quickly to reallocate street space to accommodate increased need for space to walk, cycle, or engage in outdoor commerce. However, such actions were underrepresented in southeastern US cities. We seek to identify state level actions—policies, resources, expertise—from other regions that facilitated rapid local responses and evaluate their transferability to southeastern US cities. We use existing data sources on local COVID-19 actions, which we will supplement with structured interviews with state-level officials in a sample of US states that enacted strong supports for local street space adaptations.
